WHEREAS, Hoosiers recognize the often thankless job of waste and recycling

workers; and

WHEREAS, John Arwood, second-generation owner of Arwood Site Services, began the annual observance of National Garbage Man Day on

June 17, 2012, which was renamed to Waste and Recycling

Workers Week in 2020; and

whereas, the people employed by local refuse collection and hauling

companies contracted by the State of Indiana make significant contributions to the safety, health, and welfare of our citizens;

WHEREAS, with an area spanning 36,418 square miles and thousands of

miles of roads, Indiana depends on the collection of waste and

recyclables to promote a clean and safe community and recognize them all as First Responders; and
